# Industry Symposium and Industry Track at OzCHI 2018

## General Information on Industry focused events at OzCHI 2018:

Building on last year's discussion, OzCHI 2018 aims again to bring together academics and industry practitioners with an interest in Human-Computer Interaction and User Experience Design. There will be several events as part of the OzCHI 2018 Industry events.
